Greg won moto`s one and three and the overall win and Danny won moto 2 but had a bad last race leaving the door open for Luke Smith who was never far away from the leaders to take runner up on the day, Danny had to settle for third place.

SW85cc Irish visitor Andrew Reid had a holeshot in moto 1 and led the whole race with local rider Mathew Fleming keeping him well in his sights, it was a very close battle at the chequered flag when Mathew hit the berm and dumped it a few feet from the flag. The next two races were close too but Mathew knew all the lines to take and won them both and secured the overall Andrew was runner up and a consistent Scott Hamilton was third.

BW85cc First race on his big wheel proved to be very successful for local lad Aiden Bruce who took the overall honours, he was having a great battle with the ever improving David Clarkson who was leading some of the races. David finished a well deserved runner up and David Gibson third.

Sp125cc the first two races were dominated by talented rider Tommy Fenwick but a spill in the last race spoiled his chances of a maximum. Sean Macdonald sneaked through to take the win on the day. Dale McAulay was runner up and Colin Lapinskie third.

Adults were last out with some cracking riders who had travelled from all over. Another Irish visitor who loved the sandy track was Gary Gibson, he was pretty untouchable in the first race. Jamie Duncan, Graham Riley, Drew Goudy and Colin McLuckie all had a hard fought battle to keep with him. He again won the second moto but Drew Goudy was hot on his heels. A crash in moto three left the others to battle it out. Jamie took the lead and kept it throughout and secured the overall win. Gary was one point behind to take runner up and Drew Goudy was third.

Let's hope there's larger turnout of riders turn out for the next round which is on the 19th November 2007.
